The Directors of the UKBHC met on the 4th December 2024. The following summary points are shared for information.

- The Board discussed a number of requirements from the Professional Standards Authority relating to the UKBHC maintaining Accredited Register Status. In particular, updates to the annual CPD return were agreed. Please see the <u>information for registrants and members</u> provided by the registration lead that is on the UKBHC website for full details of changes.
- The Board agreed to source a new payment process for annual fees recognising that the current system has led to delays. We will try and have this in place for early 2025, but that may not be possible.
- Sarah Crane was welcomed as the new Chair of the UKBHC having been elected at an extra-ordinary meeting of the Board in November. There is an introductory message from Sarah below.
- Issues relating to chaplaincy courses at Newman were discussed. The Board recognised that it had continued to list Newman as an accredited course despite Newman not having completed the necessary paperwork. The Registration Lead will be in contact with individuals this has affected.
